<p><a href="#">notes</a>: Clarifies that an individual who is not licensed, registered, certified, or permitted by a health regulatory board may provide health care services, therapies, and methods by assessing, evaluating, advising, educating, counseling, informing, or rendering care to consumers regarding the use of natural foods, dietary supplements, homeopathic remedies and products, and healing and natural therapies for the prevention, remedy, or treatment of various health or physical conditions as long as he discloses to consumers his qualifications and does not violate existing provisions governing the health professions.</p>

<p><a href="#">notes</a>: Expands the definition of "disaster" for purposes of the Virginia Post-Disaster Anti-Price Gouging Act to include any resource shortage in the Commonwealth that results from a disaster for which the President has declared a state of emergency and for which the Governor has issued an executive order proclaiming that a shortage exists. A resource shortage is an absence, unavailability or reduced supply of any raw or processed natural resource, or any commodities, goods or services of any kind that bear a substantial relationship to the health, safety, welfare and economic well-being of the citizens of the Commonwealth. The measure also revises the definition of "supplier" to delete the condition that a manufacturer, distributor or licensor advertise the goods or services that are to be resold, leased, or sublicensed in a consumer transaction. The definition of a "time of disaster" is clarified and amended to include the period of time during which a Governor's proclamation provides that a resource shortage exists.</p>
